



The Kingdom Prayer

Read Matthew 6:1-15

What stands out to you in these verses?

Let's explore three components of this prayer: the holy name of God (v9), the will of God (v10) and the gifts of God (vv11-13)

God's Name

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name..." Matthew 6:9

The name of God is more than simply a word that He goes by – it is all that the name represents. His name points to his character and his being – much like your name bears with it everything that people know about you. To be *hallowed* is to be greatly revered or honoured.

Jesus has got a bigger plan for you than you could ever imagine. You may have a 1, 5, or even a 50 year plan all worked out. But Jesus has eternity. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory."

Colossians 3:1-4

If what we highly cherish belongs to the realm of heaven, our hearts and minds will incline to heaven and all its values; but if what we highly cherish belongs to the realm of earth and the things that pass away, our hearts and minds will incline to those things and pray for them. After all, the Master himself taught us that our hearts will run to where our treasure lies.
